- ____ ____ 2. Demonstrate how to properly wrap your horse's legs. Explain what you are doing and why you would want or need to wrap the legs. Also demonstrate the proper use of shin boots, splints, hoof boots, do-nuts or any other manufactured leg support. Explain why you would use these, and the pros and cons of using them.
- ____ ____ 3. Explain knowledge of procedure to follow in case of mild and severe wire laceration.
- ____ ____ 4. Bring forth a creative presentation comparing breeds, their specific conformation, and the jobs that they do best. Discuss at least 6 different breeds, more if you'd like. Include copies of the breed association information.
- ____ ____ 5. Teach a beginning riding lessons. Include all the elements necessary for a balanced, strong, confident rider. Rider should walk, trot, and reverse. Evaluate the lesson and explain what you liked about it, and what you would do differently next time.
- ____ ____ 6. Complete one year of Junior or Teen Leadership in your project.
- ____ ____ 7. Explain a kind of strain on a horse and how to care for it.
- ____ ____ 8. Explain knowledge of how to care for mild and severe cases of colic.
