

## 2004 GLENN COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Nine outstanding Glenn County 4-H graduating seniors were selected April 26<sup>th</sup> to receive a total of \$3,600.00 in scholarships, reports Glenn County 4-H Program Representative Deanna Rogers. Those receiving scholarships are Megan Jorgensen, Katie McDaniel, Becky Martin, Rachel Eidman, Laura Gupton, Ritta Millsaps, Sara Taylor, Danielle Rogers and Kelley Brown.

Megan Jorgensen, of the Capay 4-H Club, is the recipient of a \$500 scholarship. She has been in 4-H for ten years and is a senior at Corning High School. She plans to attend Sonoma State University. Megan has obtained the highest 4-H rank available at the county level, that of an All Star. She has held many club offices in her 4-H club. She has been a junior leader for several years and winner of the Jr/Teen Leader Merit Award twice. Last year she was one of the Youth Directors at our annual summer camp. Megan is the daughter of Fred and Toni Jorgensen of the Capay District, Orland.
