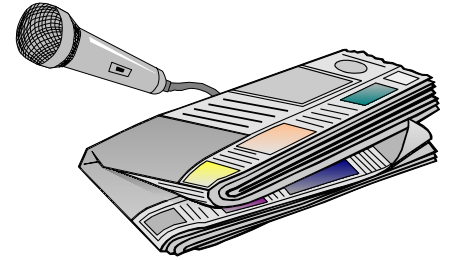

Free UCCE Pest Notes for Home and Garden

Increasing pest problems around the home and in the garden are a fact of life for spring and summer.

Doug Munier, Glenn County Farm Advisor, encourages home owners and gardeners to take advantage of the high quality pest control advice available through UC Cooperative Extension's (UCCE) free Pest Note publications.

The pests are generally grouped into the following areas: insects, diseases, weeds, and vertebrate pests. Over 100 different Pest Note publications are available. The insect Pest Notes range from ant control to delusory parasitosis. The insect Pest Notes are the most common covering other important insects like walnut husk fly, aphids, cockroaches, and many others. Lawn Diseases Prevention and Management is a sample of the disease management Pest Note publications. Weed Pest Notes address the important landscape weed nutsedge, the range weed named yellow starthistle, to the skin irritating poison oak shrub.

Take advantage of some of the states best experts knowledge in pest management by getting these valuable Pest Note publications. They are brief and easy to read and will help the homeowner solve some important pest problems. If you don't have Internet access, the Glenn County Cooperative Extension Office, at 821 E.
