



Deadline: June 25, 2012 - The State Fashion Revue committee is again sponsoring a quilting booth



4-H Hat Information

Achievement pins are fastened to the service stripes, starting with the first-year pin next to the 4-H clover. The All-Star pin should be fastened to the center of the All-Star emblem. Medals may be worn on either side of the cap, but not too many of them. No other pins or ribbons should be worn on the cap. The cap should reflect the dignity of 4-H Club work, and not be cheapened by fastening to it every emblem, award, and ribbon won by the wearer. Keep your cap clean, especially when you wear it with the full uniform.



It's That Time Of Year Again!

4-H Record Books Due To Your Key

Leader by June 30, 2012

In order to receive a year pin and stripe, you must turn in a record book on time. Additionally, if you sold an animal this year at the Glenn County Fair and intend to sell one again next year, you must also complete a record book and turn it in to your Key Leader by June 30, including signatures of your project leaders. This is your responsibility to contact your project leaders.

Please go to the Glenn County 4-H website for the 2011/2012 Record Book Information Sheet (pink sheet). This form should be the first page in your record book. Please make sure that it is complete, as this helps those that will be judging your book. Also, please make sure



that you mark on the outside upper right hand corner of your book with a label which project area you would like to be considered for, i.e., Foods & Nutrition, Swine, Clothing, Sheep, etc.

Also available on the website is the 2011/2012 County Judging Sheet (yellow sheet) that will be used in judging your record book at the club and county level.

Record Books receiving 85 points or higher at the club level are eligible to compete at the county record book judging event. Those record books need to be turned into the 4-H Office by July 12, 2012.

Each club is to provide at least three to five adults to help judge at the county event. If you are interested in helping, please contact the Key Leader of your child's club or the 4-H Office.

The Glenn County 4-H Star Ranking sheet is also available on the website, it shows what the scoring is for our county to achieve the different star ranks.

If you need any of the forms for your record book, you can stop by the 4-H Office and pick some up or you can get then online at http://ceglenn.ucdavis.edu/4-H_Program/ Record_Book_Forms.htm. There is also a Record Book Manual that is very informational and helpful that is available at the 4-H Office as well as online.





All 4-H members must submit a record book at the end of

the year in order to receive a year pin and stripe, and to sell at next year's Jr. Livestock Auction. Those that qualify can then submit their record books on to county judging. Special awards can be won (even primary members can join in this competition!). Record books will be judged overall, but particularly one project



must be chosen and competition is between those in each project. A plaque will be given for the most complete and well-regarded project book, with pins given to the next four highest point-earning books and all others will be given a certificate.
