NEW MANDATORY FAIR REQUIREMENT



Beginning January 1, 2019, the Fairs and Exposition Branch (F&E) will require all California Fairs junior exhibitors to annually participate in a

F&E approved Quality Assurance and Ethics Awareness training. All 4-H youth taking animals to the Glenn County Fair. At this time, 5-8 year olds are not required to participate in this training. The YQCA online/in-person training program is mainly geared toward those exhibitors with market projects, 9 years and older, but is required by all small and large livestock exhibitors, which includes those with only breeding projects. This training will replace our previous required Ethics Online Training.

What does this mean for 4-H?

4-H does not have any management responsibilities regarding the YQCA. The fairs are responsible for letting exhibitors know about the requirement and when the training needs to be completed. 4-H staff are not responsible for notifications, inperson trainings or verification of certificates. Please contact the Glenn County Fairgrounds for questions and more information at (530) 865-1168.

How does an exhibitor get their certificate of completion from the Online Course? A youth who is taking the YQCA training online would need a pass rate of 80% on a series of three quizzes to earn certification. They can repeat the module if needed. Youth will be able to download, print, or access their certificate number after passing from the course website, https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login, or their 4honline profile.

The YQCA online/in-person program is approved to fulfill the F&E approved Quality Assurance and Ethics Awareness training requirement. For more information, please visit www.yqca.org.

LIVESTOCK CHALLENGE WAS A BLAST!







STATE 4-H ANIMAL OWNERSHIP & SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS

- For 4-H members who are enrolled or plan to enroll in a 4-H animal project and who wish to show or exhibit
 their animal project(s) at a fair, exposition, sponsored shows, e.g., 4-H shows or other sponsored shows,
 now is a good time to review the timeframes of animal ownership and supervision members will need to
 meet for eligibility.
- Each category is outlined below. Sharing these timeframes with members will help ensure that youth in animals projects will be prepared for the 4-H year and fair season each year.
- See Ch. 7 of the policy handbook, IV. Fairs, Expositions, and Other Sponsored Shows for more information.
 - **Poultry** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
 - **Rabbits** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
 - **Feeder and breeding animals** must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
 - Market sheep, swine, veal and goats must be **owned** and supervised for not less than 60 consecutive days.
 - Market beef must be owned and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days.
 - Horses must be owned/leased and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days. Male foals may be shown by 4-H members, but yearling and older stallions are ineligible as 4-H projects. The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting on January 1 of the year foaled; it is a weanling during the calendar year in which foaled, and a yearling during the first calendar year following its foaling date, regardless of year foaled.
