A Letter from the Desk of our 4-H Program Representative





Hello 4-H Families!

They say it takes a village to raise a child, but there is no doubt we have an entire community supporting ours. 4-H is built on committed volunteers teaching our youth skills, providing resources and experiences that will last a lifetime. Along the journey they create memories and build lasting friendships. Although we will have to make adjustments to the delivery of experiences to accommodate the current state, we are very excited for the 2020-2021 program year!

This 4-H program year is going to look a little different and be delivered through a blended platform; virtual and face-to-face. It is best for us to plan on the primary delivery mode for the next four to six months, to be virtual and we will incorporate face-to-face interactions as much as possible. We will continue following the health recommendations of the Glenn County Health Officer, as well as the guidelines set by UC ANR. The current guidelines limit face-to-face interactions to outdoors and no more than 10 people (that being no less than two adults and no more than eight youth) at one event or gathering. This may sound discouraging and we understand how impactful it is to meet in person and have hands on opportunities, and we can still do that, we just have to work through a few obstacles. With an open mind and your help, we can work together through this challenging time and still provide our youth with opportunities and keep them engaged.

Uncertain of the opportunities to sell animal projects, several people have asked if they should buy animals this year. Unfortunately, we do not know what the future holds and that's ok. Youth members can enroll in animal projects, even without actually purchasing an animal. The purpose of any project is to provide new experiences and education to our youth, this is something that can still be achieved.

4-H provides youth with many wonderful opportunities to learn new skills and share in new experiences through various projects and opportunities. With the current guidelines being limited to small groups, I ask that you be patient with our Leaders as they maneuver through new delivery modes and their own challenges. 

COUNTY-WIDE ELECTRICITY PROJECT



Failure to Reapply as a 4-H Adult Volunteer (Break in Service) State 4-H Policy

- 1. 4-H adult volunteers who do not annually reapply to continue as a 4-H adult volunteer are considered to have a break in service and may not serve as 4-H adult volunteers.
- 2. 4-H YDP staff must send a list of names and birthdates of all 4-H adult volunteers that do not reapply to the Custodian of Criminal Records at the UC ANR Office of Risk Services and State of California, Department of Justice (DOJ) by July 31 of each year.
- If the person applies to be a 4-H adult volunteer at some point in the future, they will need to repeat the volunteer application and enrollment process, including live-scan criminal records check.
