

MANDATORY FAIR REQUIREMENT



Starting in 2019, the State of California began requiring all junior livestock exhibitors to complete the ethics training Youth for Quality Care of Animals (YQCA).

All Glenn County junior exhibitors need to have this training complete by the entry close date of April 20th. Due to COVID-19, 2021 trainings will only be offered online for \$12.00 per exhibitor. To register and completed this training please visit yqca.org. The confirmation number received upon completion must be entered into your online entry. Online entries will open February 20th.

What does this mean for 4-H?

4-H does not have any management responsibilities regarding the YQCA. The fairs are responsible for letting exhibitors know about the requirement and when the training needs to be completed. 4-H staff are not responsible for notifications, inperson trainings or verification of certificates. How does an exhibitor get their certificate of completion from the Online Course? A youth who is taking the YQCA training online would need a pass rate of 80% on a series of three quizzes to earn certification. They can repeat the module if needed. Youth will be able to download, print, or access their certificate number after passing from the course website, https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login, or their 4honline profile.

The YQCA online/in-person program is approved to fulfill the F&E approved Quality Assurance and Ethics Awareness training requirement. For more information, please visit www.yqca.org.

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GLENN COUNTY 4-H STAFF REPORT

GUIDANCE POLICY

UC ANR is focused on keeping the members of our program as safe as possible by implementing science based guidelines. It is our responsibility to ensure we do our due diligence and adhere to the policy's established by UC ANR. These guidelines are to be implemented across all of 4-H in our clubs, projects and events. The protection of members is of utmost importance in the 4-H YDP. Preventing one-on-one interactions between members, as well as between members and adult participants (volunteer and other adults), is a cornerstone of the 4-H youth protection strategy. So what do these guidelines look like for our program?

IN-PERSON MEETING/GATHERING Guidance Policy

- Outdoor meetings/gatherings
- No more than 10 people, consisting of no less than two adults and no more than eight youth.
- Masks must be worn when social distancing can not be maintained.

VIRTUAL MEETING Guidance Policy

- Ensure a minimum of two approved 4-H Adult Volunteers (*If two cannot be present, one 4-H Adult Volunteer and another adult at least 21 years old or staff must participate) are in place for virtual or conference call 4-H meetings and are connected prior to members arriving.
- Members should identify themselves with their first name only.
- Use only "group chat" and turn off "private chat" in any virtual meeting.
- For club meetings, officers should fulfill their normal responsibilities for leading the meeting, taking minutes, etc.
- Do not record the meeting.
- Turn off "screen sharing" for participants. You can grant screen sharing for individual members as needed.
- Only approved 4-H Adult Volunteer leaders may host virtual or conference call 4-H meetings.
