2016 GLENN COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Seven outstanding Glenn County 4-H graduating seniors were selected April 7, 2016, to receive a total of \$1,500.00 in scholarships, reports Glenn County Director Betsy Karle. Those receiving scholarships are Lainie Alves, Tucker Hammons, Jordan Sanchez, Michael Sanchez, Kayla Tuma, Ally Zuppan and Danielle Zuppan.

Lainie Alves of the Clover 4-H Club is the recipient of a \$300 Glenn County 4-H Council Scholarship. She has been in 4-H for 12 years and is a senior at Willows High School. She has been involved in many 4-H projects including arts and crafts, cooking, sheep, swine, small engines, baking and bread making, cooking and teen council. She has held the position of club reporter and secretary and has served at many county functions. Lainie will be attending Arizona Christian University, where she will be playing softball and majoring in biology. She plans to transfer to a nursing program and earn both her Bachelor of Science and Registered Nurse degrees.
