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2023 GLENN COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Glenn County 4-H conducted its scholarship interviews for graduating seniors on Thursday, April 6, 2023. Four very impressive youth members were evaluated on their application, individual interviews, and growth in the 4-H program. All four scholarship recipients have gained work experience throughout their high school careers, been involved in other organizations, and have worked hard to maintain their exceptional grades throughout high school. Scholarship recipients were awarded a combined amount of \$1,750 to further pursue higher education.

Kate Amaro, a member of the Willows 4-H Club, has been in 4-H for nine years and is a Senior at Willows High School. She has participated in the Rabbit project and Teen Council. Some of Kate's highlights in 4-H include being a Junior Leader, a Teen Leader for two years, a Club Officer, a committee member for multiple club activities, and has earned her 4-H Platinum Star.
