

It's That Time Of Year Again! 4-H Record Books Due To Your Key Leader by June 30, 2009



In order to receive a year pin and stripe, you must turn in a record book on time. Additionally, if you sold an animal this year at the Glenn County Fair and intend to sell one again next year, you must also complete a record book and turn it in to

your Key Leader on time including signatures of your project leaders. This is your responsibility to contact your project leaders.

Please find insert in the Roundup a copy of the Record Book Information Sheet (pink sheet). This form should be the first page in your record book. Please make sure that it is complete, as this helps those that will be judging your book. Also, please make sure that you mark on the outside upper right hand corner of your book with a label which project area you would like to be considered for, i.e., Foods & Nutrition, Swine, Clothing, Sheep, etc.

Also inserted is a copy of the judging sheet (yellow sheet) that will be used in judging your record book at the club and county level.

Record Books receiving 70 points or higher at the club level are eligible to compete at the county record book judging event. Those record books need to be turned into the 4-H Office by **July 16, 2009**.

Each club is to provide at least three to five adults to help judge at the county event. If you are interested in helping, please contact the Key Leader of your child's club or the 4-H Office.

The Glenn County 4-H Star Ranking sheet is also enclosed that shows what the scoring is for our county to achieve the different star ranks.

If you need any of the forms for your record book, you can stop by the 4-H Office and pick some up or you can get then online at http://www.ca4h.org/4hresource/forms/index.asp. There is also a Record Book Manual that is very informational and helpful that is available at the 4-H Office as well as online.





How To Receive A 4-H Year Pin and

Stripe

HOW???

Turn in your 4-H Record Book to your local 4-H leader or the 4-H Office with a Personal Development Report and an Annual Project Report for each project completed this year by **SATURDAY**, **JUNE 30TH.** (If you are going to apply for a Project Award Medal, read the article "Record Book Project Awards" for more details.)

If you need a record book cover or project sheets, contact the 4-H Office at 865-1107. If you need help, contact a local 4-H Leader.

The Year Pin & Stripe will be given at your club's fall Achievement Awards Program or dinner. Check the September 4-H Roundup for the dates of these award programs or call your key leader.

Record Book Project Awards

All 4-H members must submit a record book at the end of the year in order to receive a year pin and stripe, and to sell at next year's Jr. Livestock Auction. Those with a gold seal can then submit their record books on to county judging. Special awards can be won (even primary members can join in this competition!). Record books will be judged overall, but particularly one project must be chosen and competition is between those in each project. A plaque will be given for the most complete and well-regarded project book, with pins given to the next four highest point-earning books and all others will be given a certificate. *Record books are due to your Key Leader by June 30*.

Special Home Economics Awards

If you are enrolled in a home economics project (food preservation, foods & nutrition, cake decorating, arts & crafts, leathercraft, mini gardens, ceramics, clothing, quilting, woodworking or photography, etc.), you can apply for the special home economics awards. The top scoring person in each grade division IN EACH PROJECT will receive a trophy. Forms were included in the March Roundup regarding these special awards. Forms are also available at the 4-H Office or on our website. Be sure to ask questions of your project leaders, as well. They can be very helpful in getting members organized for these special awards. Forms must be turned into the 4-H Office by June 30.
