Willows Area & Orland Area New Member Sign-Up Meetings Scheduled

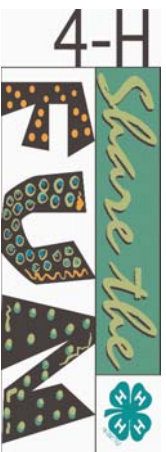

Adult & Youth Re-enrollment Forms On The Way...

You will be receiving re-enrollment forms from your Key Leaders. Statewide 4-H has been in the process of changing the enrollment system for the past year. After you receive the forms, please complete them entirely and return them to your Key Leader with enrollment fees. *Enrollment cannot be accepted until all signatures, information and payment are received.*

Also, new this year, ALL ADULT VOLUNTEERS must be enrolled or re-enrolled by December 1, 2009.



The Glenn County 4-H Council deadline for enrollment is the **last Monday in September**. This means you must be enrolled in a 4-H club by **Monday, September 28, 2009**, if you wish to participate in the 2010 Glenn County Fair as a 4-H member. 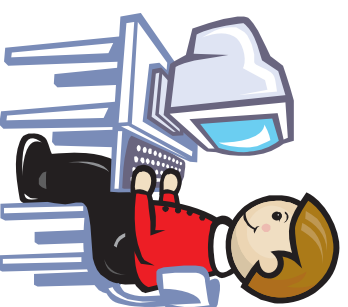
