

Make note, all those 4-H presenters qualifying at the county level are invited to attend the annual sectional event.





4-H/FFA/Junior Grange Membership Clarified

U When a member maintains projects in 4-H, FFA and Junior Grange, the projects MAY NOT be in the same kind of livestock or crop. For example, a beef project in FFA and a sheep project in 4-H is acceptable; but a beef breeding project in FFA and a beef market project in 4-H is not acceptable, even if the animals were of different breeds

U A member of FFA, 4-H or Junior Grange may transfer projects from one organization to another only once during the calendar year (Jan. 1st - Dec. 31st). To be able to show a project at a fair or show, it must be under the supervision of the organization under which it will be shown for at least 60 days prior to the fair or show (120 days for market beef).



/ Non-Market Animal projects at the fair, members must complete the following:

- * Attend 70% of club meetings prior to the fair;
- * Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with Key Leader approval;
- * Participate in a countywide 4-H event in project area or Presentation Day;




* Be enrolled in 4-H by the third Monday in December (Next year it will be the 3rd Monday in November).

Livestock Requirements

In order to be eligible to exhibit and sell an animal at the fair, including replacement heifers, members must complete the following:

- * Attend 70% of club meetings prior to the fair;
- * Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with



- * Attend field day of species selling
- * Give a demonstration or judge at Presentation Day; (to qualify to judge: must be 8th grade or older and have given one gold demonstration in the past.) (minutes 12-5-96)
- * Attend animal ethics training every other year;
- * Attend a minimum of four (4) project meetings in project area;
- * Be enrolled in 4-H by the third Monday in December (Next year it will be the 3rd Monday in November);
- * May only sell one (1) animal;
- * Turn in record book on time to be eligible to sell at following year's fair.


Camp Counselor Meeting Dates

Placement Of Pins On 4-H Hat

Achievement pins are fastened to the service stripes, starting with the first-year pin next to the 4-H clover. The All-Star pin should be fastened to the center of the All-Star emblem. Medals may be worn on either side of the cap, but not too many of them. No other pins or ribbons should be worn on the cap. The cap should reflect the dignity of 4-H Club work, and not be cheapened by fastening to it every emblem, award, and ribbon won by the wearer.

Keep your cap clean, especially when you wear it with the full uniform.
