4-H/FFA/Junior Grange Membership Clarified

/ When a member maintains projects in 4-H, FFA and Junior Grange, the projects MAY NOT be in the same kind of livestock or crop. For example, a beef project in FFA and a sheep project in 4-H is acceptable; but a beef breeding project in FFA and a beef market project in 4-H is not acceptable, even if the animals were of different breeds.

/A member of FFA, 4-H or Junior Grange may transfer projects from one organization to another only once during the calendar year (Jan. 1st - Dec. 31st). To be able to show a project at a fair or show, it must be under the supervision of the organization under which it will be shown for at least 60 days prior to the fair or show (120 days for market beef).

Fair Minimum Requirements

Home Ec./Still Exhibits/

Non-Market Animal Requirements

In order to be eligible to exhibit Home Ec./Still Exhibits / Non-Market Animal projects at the fair, members must complete the following:

- * Attend 70% of club meetings prior to the fair;
- * Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with Key Leader approval;
- * Participate in a countywide 4-H event in project area or Presentation Day;
- * Attend a minimum of four (4) project meetings in project area;
- * Be enrolled in 4-H by the third Monday in December (Next year it will be the 3rd Monday in November).

Livestock Requirements

In order to be eligible to exhibit and sell an animal at the fair, including replacement heifers, members must complete the following:

- * Attend 70% of club meeting prior to the fair;
- * Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with

Key Leader approval;

- * Attend field day of species selling
- * Give a demonstration or judge at Presentation Day; (to qualify to judge: must be 8th grade or older and have given one gold demonstration in the past.) (minutes 12-5-96)
- * Attend animal ethics training every other year;
- * Attend a minimum of four (4) project meetings in project area;
- * Be enrolled in 4-H by the third Monday in December (Next year it will be the 3rd Monday in November);
- * May only sell one (1) animal;
- * Turn in record book on time to be eligible to sell at following year's fair.

Home Ec./Non Livestock Make Ups


The 4-H Office has received several phone calls regarding make-ups for those members who were not able to attend the Food Fiesta or Home Ec. Field Day held on January 12th. Remember each member is to attend a countywide event, so that they can enter their projects in the fair.

If you are not planning on participating in the

Fashion Revue & Quilt Show or the County Presentation Day, you need to contact your project leader and set up a suitable make-up. Project leaders, please make sure that it is documented what the make-up is and send it to the 4-H Office.

After meeting with the committee planning the Fashion Revue & Quilt Show, it was determined that there would not be room for make-up displays. Therefore, if you wanted to use that event as a make-up, you will need to contact the 4-H Office and see how you can help with decorations, etc. and also attend the Revue portion that evening.

This is not the only way to make-up your requirement of attending a countywide home ec. event. You may write a report on a particular topic that your leader feels is suitable four to five pages is recommended. You may also do a community service, for example, one cooking group is getting together to make cookies and then taking them to one of the local rest homes and spending time with the residents. Some other ideas are doing a clean-up project or tutoring younger children. If you need some additional ideas for community service, please call the 4-H Office.

2002 California State Fair Scholarship Program

The California State Fair Scholarship Program has been initiated through the generous financial support of the Exxon Company, U.S.A. The program, established for the purpose of developing and implementing a California State Fair Scholarship Program, is a collaborative project of the California State Fair, the California State Fair Agricultural Council, the State Fair Gala Committee, and the Friends of the California State Fair.

This year a total of 20 scholarships will be available, seven at \$1,000 each, three at \$500 each, seven at \$250 each, and three at \$125. In addition, one \$5,000 scholarship shall be awarded to the outstanding candidate. When developing your application packet, please be specific to your category of choice. Applications must be received at the State Fair Office by 5:00 p.m., Friday, March 29, 2002. For more information about the scholarship, go to "bigfun.org" on the internet.

4-H Summer Camp

Mark your calendars! Camp this year will be from

August 10-13,2002. Camp is for youth 4th - 8th grade (this is the grade you will be entering in the fall). Those in K - 3rd grade may attend, but must have an adult attend who is responsible for them. Youth



who will be in the 9th grade or above may apply for a counselor position. Applications will be mailed to those who are eligible. Any 4-H leader or parent who would like to help must attend at least two of the five meetings. Please remember that if we don't receive the adult volunteers needed (men included), camp will be canceled.

Record Book Project Awards

All 4-H members must submit a record book at the end of the year in order to receive a year pin and stripe, and to sell at next year's Jr. Livestock Auction. Those with a gold seal can then submit their record books on to county judging. Special awards can be won (even primary members can join in this competition!). Record books will be

judged overall, but particularly one project must be chosen and competition is between those in each project. A plaque will be given for the most complete and well-regarded project book, with pins given to the next four highest point-earning books and all others will be given a certificate.



2002-2003 State Ambassadors (formerly Diamond Star)

Information packets and applications for 2002-2003 State Ambassadors are now available at the 4-H Office. Age requirement is at least 16 years of age (as of Dec. 31, 2002) and no older than 18 (as of Dec. 31, 2002). Youth with exemplary leadership and community service experience who can represent the University of California and the entire 4-H Youth Development program in a professional manner are encouraged to apply. Applications are due to the 4-H Office by March 25, 2002.

Market Animal Report

Remember, the Market Animal Report Form needs to be filled out on the front side at the beginning of the year (now) and signed by the member, a parent and the project leader. The back page is to be completed and turned in with your fair entry form. At that time, the form needs to be signed by the member, a parent, project leader and the key leader. You will not be able to exhibit at the fair if this form is not completed (including all signatures).

Animal Ethics Training

Each 4-H member who is planning to sell at the 2002 Jr. Livestock Auction must fulfill the requirements listed on the Market Animal Report. One of those requirements is to attend an animal ethics training every other year.


Attention Dairy Members
