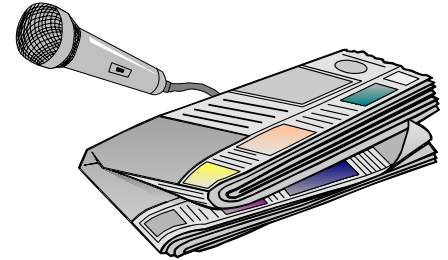

GLENN COUNTY 4-H SUMMER CAMP LOOKING FOR HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH COUNSELORS

The Glenn County 4-H Youth Development Program sponsors a resident youth summer camp every year for youth 4th-8th grades (**current 4-H membership is not required**). This year camp is scheduled for **Thursday, July 6th - Monday, July 10th**, reports Deanna Rogers, 4-H Program Representative. The camp facility is located at Camp Tehama in Lassen National Forest near Mill Creek, California. The average participation is about 100 campers each year. The camp is staffed by 4-H personnel, volunteer adult leaders and high school age camp counselors. The 4-H Camp is a rustic camp with the philosophy of providing an exciting outdoor educational experience to as many youth as possible. The goal of the Glenn County 4-H camp program is to provide youth an opportunity for growth and development in mental, physical, social and leadership skills.

We are in need of teen and adult volunteers; two high school youth to serve as youth directors, and about 10 high school age boys and 10 high school age girls to serve as camp youth counselors. The camp youth counselor's experience is intended to be a positive leadership development activity for high school youth. Adults are needed to assist with activities and to serve as advisors.

Camp Youth Counselor Qualifications: Need to have completed the eighth grade by July 1, 2006. Prior camp experience and 4-H membership is not required. Non 4-H members will have to pay an additional \$10.00 to cover enrollment costs (insurance, curriculum & scholarship fees). You are required to attend four of the six

planning meetings. Your major responsibilities as a counselor will be to serve the campers. You will be expected to provide an enjoyable educational experience for younger youth campers: willing to serve as a "Big Brother/Sister" to six or seven campers; stay in the cabins with the campers and go to bed at the scheduled curfew; participate in all planned camp activities with your assigned campers; and provide leadership and assistance in program areas and other activities. We need youth who can exert a positive influence on younger campers through close contact with them. You will be expected to set a good example through enthusiasm, excitement, positive human development attitudes, and time commitment at camp. Contact the 4-H Office at 865-1107 for an application. The total fee to participate as a counselor will be approximately \$35.00, plus \$10.00, if not a current 4-H member. Fees do not cover transportation to and from camp; you will be required to make your own arrangements. Applications are due back in the 4-H Office on Wednesday, March 1st. The interviews will be held on Tuesday, March 14th, and Wednesday, March 15th, beginning at 6:00 p.m., call the 4-H Office to schedule your interview time for the date that is best for you.
