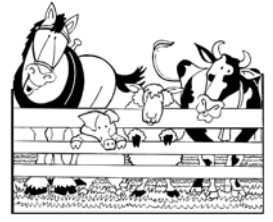


GLENN COUNTY FAIR MAY 16-20, 2007

The 2007 Glenn County Fair is fast approaching. It is scheduled for May 16-20, 2007, and this year's theme is "Lambs, Hams, Quilts & Jams." Keep your eyes open for this section of the Roundup for all your fair information.

Glenn County Fair Buyers Thank You Dinner

This year the appreciation dinner will be prepared by the Plaza 4-H Club. The dinner will be held on **Friday, April 20, 2007**. 4-H clubs and FFA chapters have been asked to provide at least 2 gift baskets each as door prizes. Please drop off baskets at the 4-H Office by **Wednesday, April 16, 2007**. Make sure that you attach a tag identifying your basket's origin. "Zero Tolerance" Policy

Glenn County Fair, in conjunction with local law enforcement agencies, has adopted a "Zero Tolerance" policy. This policy says simply, any minor caught drinking an alcoholic beverage, in possession of an alcoholic beverage, or giving alcohol to other minors will be arrested, turned over to the local police department and prosecuted to the extent of the law. Youth exhibiting at the fair will be dismissed from the grounds with their livestock. They will not be eligible to exhibit, sell or collect any awards or premiums.

Fairgrounds Vehicle Restriction

Each exhibitor will be issued a vehicle "Feeding Pass" that will allow your vehicle entry onto the Fairgrounds each day of the fair from 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. to feed and care for your animals and to perform other husbandry duties. At 10:00 a.m. all vehicles must be off the fairgrounds property. Vehicles with "Feeding Passes" must leave the grounds through Gate E, the Livestock Gate. Vehicle/exhibitors who have purchased a "Parking Pass" for \$20 shall move their vehicles to the Livestock Parking Lot west of the livestock barns. **Vehicles that remain on the Grounds after 10:00 a.m. are subject to "towing" at owners expense and can be towed without notice. There will be one vehicle pass per**

Join The Glenn County Fair Parade

Glenn County Fair Parade will be on **Saturday, May 19, 2007** at 9:00 a.m. Parade entry deadline is **May 14, 2007**, by 1:00 p.m. The cost is \$25 per entry. For more information or an entry blank, contact the Orland Chamber of Commerce, 722 Papst Ave., 865-2311.

Animals & Drugs: Take Note!

If you are bringing an animal to the Glenn County Fair – remember that no unauthorized chemicals can be used which would cause the carcass to fail USDA and Food & Drug Administration standards. This *also includes* the use of steroids! Be sure that the withdraw time required of any medication, including medicated feed or pesticides are followed. If drug residue is detected, you can be liable to the buyer for an amount equal to **three times the purchase price** and may also be liable for **attorney's fees and civil penalties.**

Code Of Conduct For All Exhibitors

There will be rules of conduct that exhibitors and leaders are expected to adhere to again this year. These will be posted in the livestock area and provided to exhibitors. Exhibitors must sign a code of conduct and turn it in before your animals are brought to the fair.

Wild Animal Policy

You may be asked to remove your animal from the grounds by ~~agreement of the Fair Manager and Livestock Superintendent,~~ if you are unable to control your animal at the fair. For the safety of fair goers and exhibitors, it is mandatory that you can control your animal.

Attention: All Livestock Leaders & Members

The following are some additional rules and regulations that will be enforced at the 2007 Glenn County Fair.

1. Any animal with a communicable disease or unsightly condition will be excused from the Fairgrounds at any time during the fair.
2. All extra market animals will be taken from the Fairgrounds between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., **Friday, May 18, 2007**. If animals are left at the fair after this hour, the youth will not be allowed to sell their first animal at the Livestock Auction on Saturday.
3. There will be a "Live Carcass Contest" offered to all market animal exhibitors. Beef animals will be scanned on **Monday, May 14**, other species on **Tuesday, May 15**.
4. All lambs must be sheared.
5. There will be separate forms for market and breeding animals.
6. There will be a list in the Glenn County Fair Premium Book of all regulations and forms that need to be completed before fair entry is accepted.
7. Exhibitors must have a Bill of Sale for each market animal. This applies to every specie.

REMOVAL OF 2nd MARKET ANIMALS . . . *Between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., Friday, May 18*
All second market animals (any animal that has been tagged and will not be sold through the JLA) must be removed and taken home on **Friday, May 18th**, between **7:00 a.m. - 9:00 a.m.** If a second animal remains after this time, you will not be allowed to sell the first animal.

FAIR TICKET COSTS *Deadline is May 16, 5:00 p.m.*
Regular season passes can be purchased for \$25.00. Deadline for purchase of these season tickets is **May 16**. Entry blanks and premium books are available at the Fair Office in Orland.

LEADERS' WRISTBANDS & CAR PASSES
This year the reduced price for a leaders' wristband is \$20.00. You should have received a postcard in the mail. You will need to take the postcard to the **FAIR OFFICE** in order to purchase your wristband at the reduced price. The vehicle parking passes are \$20.00 each, one per family.

BEEF MEMBERS TAKE NOTE
All beef animals are to have neck ropes on them while they are being stalled. All beef animals must have Bill of Sale, Yellow slip with entry.

NO DISEASED ANIMALS ON FAIRGROUNDS
Any animal with a communicable disease or unsightly condition will be excused from the Fairgrounds at any time during the fair.

MARKET ANIMAL CONTESTS
There will be a Live Carcass Contest, Rate of Gain Contest offered to all market animal exhibitors. Beef animals will be scanned on **Monday, May 14**, other species on **Tuesday, May 15**.

EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY CONTEST

Again this year the Glenn County Fair will hold an educational display contest. Start getting your ideas and display together now. You may enter as an individual or group.

ADDITIONAL LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

Animals cannot be replaced 30 days before fair. All entries will need a bill of sale. You need to contact Jim Jones, Vice President of the Jr. Livestock Committee at 865-2835, if you have a lost eartag and need it replaced.

ATTENTION ALL SHEEP & GOAT PROJECT MEMBERS

If you are entering animals in the fair, you must have a scrapies tag and bill of sale for them. This includes all breeding animals, market animals and pygmy goats. All lambs must be sheared.
