



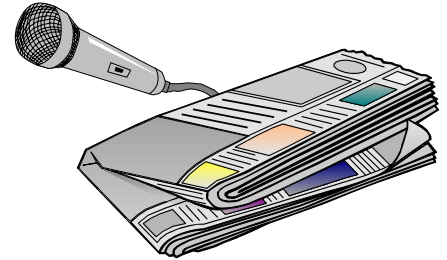

## **2007 GLENN COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED**

Eight outstanding Glenn County 4-H graduating seniors were selected April 5, 2007, to receive a total of \$3,500.00 in scholarships, reports Glenn County 4-H Program Representative Deanna Rogers. Those receiving scholarships are Frank Howard, Chelsea Beccera, Lilly Villa, Christine Evans, Travis Fissori, Michael Martin, Brent Bickley and Martin Valleza.

Frank Howard, of the Stoney Creek 4-H Club, is the recipient of a \$500.00 scholarship. He has been in 4-H for nine years and is a senior at Orland High School. He plans to attend Butte Community College and then transfer to a university and major in agriculture business. Frank obtained the highest 4-H rank available at the county level, that of an All Star. His main projects have been market goats, breeding goats, market steers, beef breeding project and the College Bound Project. Frank is the son of Dave and Cheryl Howard of Orland.

Chelsea Becerra, of the Schaffert 4-H Club, is also a recipient of a \$500.00 scholarship. She has been a 4-H member for 10 years and is a senior at Mercy High School.
