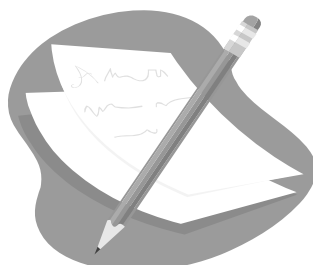

Information For Star Awards BBQ/Social

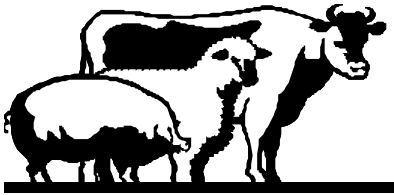

This meeting is to discuss livestock issues from the 2007 Glenn County Fair. They are asking that they receive written material outlining concerns by September 12, 2007. New Opportunity for Livestock 4-H Project Leaders and Members . . .



Learning how to assess and prevent the spread of diseases, gain an understanding of some diseases of sheep, swine and cattle, learn more about animal identification system and how to use a GPS unit! Does this interest YOU as a project leader or member?

A new curriculum, Biosecurity Issues in 4-H Animal Science Projects, is being developed by 4-H and the School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of California at Davis for 4th - 8th graders. Volunteer leaders will participate in training using a distance learning model and will implement the biosecurity curriculum with youth in their clubs. Outcome data will be collected from volunteers with respect to the training method and with youth measuring impacts on content knowledge, science process skills and life skills.

Counties participating are Glenn, Tehama, Merced, Butte, and San Diego. The timeline is attending training via video conferencing, internet and phone and implementing the seven (7) lessons with youth by late November. This pilot is being funded UC ANR and the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA).

The first leader training will be held on Saturday, September 15th, at the Glenn County UCCE 4-H Office from 8:30 until 12 noon. If you are interested, please contact Jeanne George at 527-3101 by September 10th. Your interest and involvement would be much appreciated.

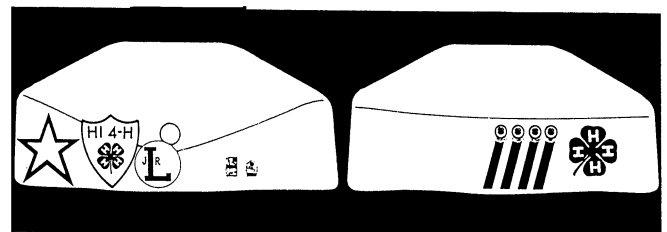

4-H Hat Information

Achievement pins are fastened to the service stripes, starting with the first-year pin next to the 4-H clover. The All-Star pin should be fastened to the center of the All-Star emblem. Medals may be worn on either side of the cap, but not too many of them. No other pins or ribbons should be worn on the cap. The cap should reflect the dignity of 4-H Club work, and not be cheapened by fastening to it every emblem, award, and ribbon won by the wearer. Keep your cap clean, especially when you wear it with the full uniform. Your 4-H hat identifies you as a member of this national youth organization and serves to display many of your achievements. You may wear your hat to 4-H activities such as tours, meetings and field days. Items worn on your hat are: **STRIPES:** A service stripe is worn for each completed year of 4-H. A gold stripe is worn instead of the regular stripes for each completed year of Junior or Teen Leadership. Service stripes are worn on the right side of the hat behind the 4-H clover. **ACHIEVEMENT PINS:** Yearly pins are earned for each year of 4-H completed and fastened to the top of the service stripe. **STARS:** The Bronze, Silver, Gold and All-Star Emblems are worn on the left front of your cap. Only one star is worn at a time... the highest star earned. Other emblems such as Junior Leader and Hi 4-H are worn on the left side of the hat behind the star award. The Junior Leader emblem is worn only while the member is serving as a Junior or Teen Leader. An All Star pin should be fastened to the center of the All Star emblem. **MEDALS:** Other medals earned may be worn at the back of either side of the cap. Use discretion as to the number and kind of medals attached so you do not cheapen your hat. The green hat is worn by members through eighth grade and the white hat is worn by members in the ninth grade and above.
