



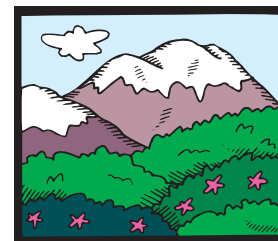

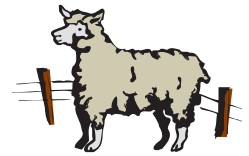
## What Weights Should Your Animals Be By Fair?

Here are the weight ranges as listed in the premium book. Animals exceeding the top weight limit will be sold at the upper limit as listed, if they grade appropriately. Animals below the minimum weight do not sell.

Market Beef .....	1,000 - 1,400 lbs.
Market Swine .....	.215 - 280 lbs.
Market Lambs .....	.110 - 155 lbs.
Market Goats .....	.60 - 120 lbs.

## 4-H TEENS & FRIENDS: Would you like to earn \$10 cash?

Glenn County 4-H is participating in a nationwide survey "4-H Study of Positive Youth Development." This is a longitudinal study entering its fifth year and is in partnership with Tufts University. Currently, about 4,000 teens are participating in the study nationwide. The state 4-H program is joining the study to collect data from California youth. Teens, 13 years of age & older, are invited to participate. You will take a survey this year and again in the following two years. The purpose of the research is to identify characteristics that are related to positive youth development. Some examples of these characteristics include having close friends and/or supportive adults in your life, receiving good grades in school, and having, overall, good feelings about yourself. Researchers want to understand how positive influences in the lives of youth help protect them from getting involved in "problem behaviors", such as substance abuse, unsafe sex, school failure, delinquency, and violence. The study should help identify ways that schools and programs like 4-H can promote positive youth development. Each participating teen will receive \$10 cash. Our goal is to have 20 4-Hers and 20 non-4-Hers take the survey. 4-Hers are encouraged to recruit friends to participate. Prior to participating, all teens must receive parent permission. Contact the 4-H Office for the required forms or watch your mail. A June date and survey location will be announced. Tentative plans are to do the survey online at Butte College Glenn County Center, Orland, or by paper at the 4-H Office. Food may be served at the conclusion of the survey session. 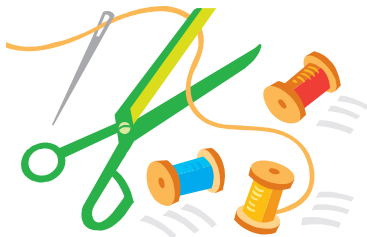
## 2008 State 4-H Presentation Day

## Record Book Project Awards

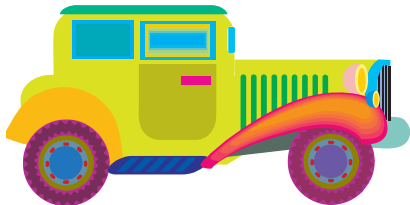
All 4-H members must submit a record book at the end of the year in order to receive a year pin and stripe, and to sell at next year's Jr. Livestock Auction. Special awards can be won. Record books will be judged overall, but particularly one project must be chosen and competition is between those in each project. A plaque will be given for the most complete and well-regarded project book, with pins given to the next four highest point-earning books and all others will be given a certificate. ## **Use of Horse Arena at Glenn County Fairgrounds**

The 4-H Horse Arena at the Fairgrounds will be available to any 4-H horse group that needs to use it. This is for 4-H meetings only, not for personal use. The procedure on reserving the arena is to call the 4-H Office and give them the dates that you would like to use it. This must be done at least one week prior to the meeting. After the dates are cleared with the fairgrounds, the 4-H staff will get back to you to let you know if the dates you requested will be okay. If these rules are not followed, the use of the arena may be taken away from the 4-H program.

Californians who would like to enter market livestock in the Livestock Show at the 2008 California State Fair must first register for the DNA Reservation and Collection online at [www.bigfun.org](http://www.bigfun.org). The Fair requires DNA registration to verify ownership and prevent unlawful switching of animals before or during the competition. No market animal will be eligible for official entry unless this sample is obtained and an official Market Registration form has been completed by the deadline. ## **4-H Million Trees Project**

The 4-H Million Trees Project was conceived to do something to help combat global climate change. The Pacific 4-H Club in San Mateo County applied for a grant from the California 4-H Service-Learning RFP to initiate the project. Their goal is to mobilize the approximately 7 million 4-H youth in the U.S. to plant 1,000,000 trees across the

## **Jackpot Shows & 4-H**

This is the season for jackpot shows in the north state. A jackpot show is defined as one in which entry fees are charged and cash prizes or premiums are awarded from the accumulated entry fees or other matching funds. However, the ownership and project participation entry requirements of jackpot shows and the handling of premium funds are not consistent with University and state 4-H policies and practices. Therefore, youth may participate in jackpot shows as an individual with their insurance program and protection under the UC liability program will not be extended to include jackpot shows. In addition, 4-H clubs, projects, groups, or councils will not sponsor, co-sponsor or host in any way, jackpot shows. If you have questions, please contact your local 4-H Office. Each year approximately 300 of Glenn County's youth participate in the Glenn County Fair and Auction, exhibiting and selling the livestock they have raised through local 4-H and FFA programs. Taking on these projects is a large responsibility which requires an extraordinary amount of time. The lessons they learn are priceless and will be carried with them throughout life. They learn personal skills such as work ethics and time management; and specific lessons about the importance of nutrition and exercise, as well as, basic caring and grooming of an animal. The effort these children put forth is rewarded monetarily through the Junior Livestock Auction. They use the money for a wide range of things: school supplies, clothes, cars, next year's project, and college. In 2002, in an effort to support this positive youth activity, four local businesses established a buyers' group. The Group's sole purpose is to financially support youth selling animals through the Glenn County Fair Junior Livestock Auction. The Buyers' Group continues to grow and support many local youth through the purchase of their livestock projects. The dollars contributed will be used to purchase 4-H and/or FFA "no bid" animals, or for general price support. A "no bid" animal is a sale animal that fails to have an opening bid and any follow up bid. The Group will open the bid and purchase the animal if no subsequent bid is taken. Once the sale is concluded, any remaining funds will be used as price supports to raise any below average sale prices. We invite you to attend the auction and witness the successful completion of these livestock projects by our county's young people. The Glenn County Junior Livestock Auction is **May 17, 2008**. 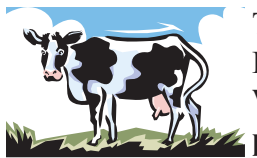

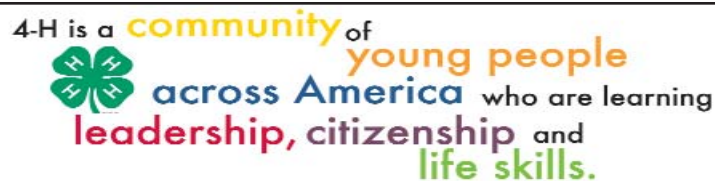
