

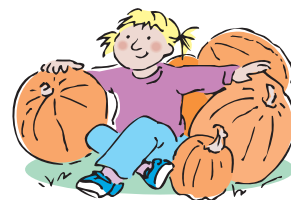

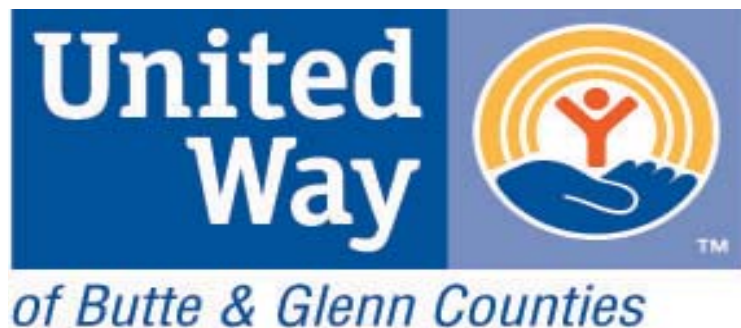

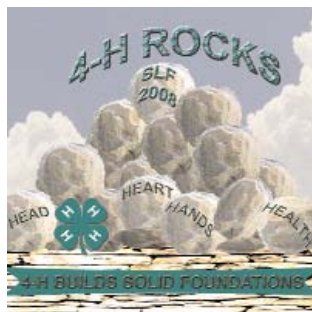

Volunteer Enrollment

After completing these requirements satisfactorily, a leader appointment card will be issued. Any parent who volunteers to chaperone at an event (including 4-H camp) must sign-up as a 4-H leader and go through the above process prior to the event. If you are a volunteer and are not having a project this year but will be returning next year, you may want to keep your enrollment current so you won't need to go through the entire process next year.

We are asking each of you to recruit one new leader. We know everyone is busy with school, church, etc., so encourage them to take the team approach. Two or three leaders can share the six hour minimum project requirement, making their time commitment for a project not as demanding. Without our volunteer leaders, the projects available will decrease and so will our enrollment. Let's all help to keep our youth in Glenn County involved, off the streets and not idle. Also, please remember that all facili-

ty use agreements/contracts (for use of school, city, county, state & private facilities) entered into by anyone in the 4-H Program must be sent to the 4-H Office for review and can only be signed by the County Director.
