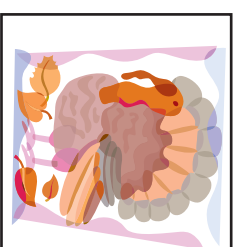

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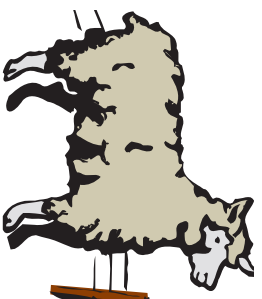
4-H Week Window Display Contest Results

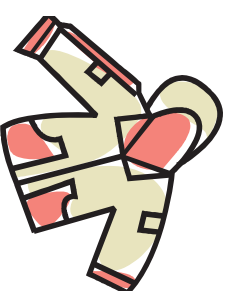

Glenn County 4-H "Coats For Kids"



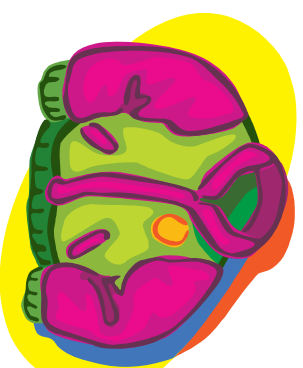

⇨ Glenn County 4-H Office, 821 E. South Street in Orland;

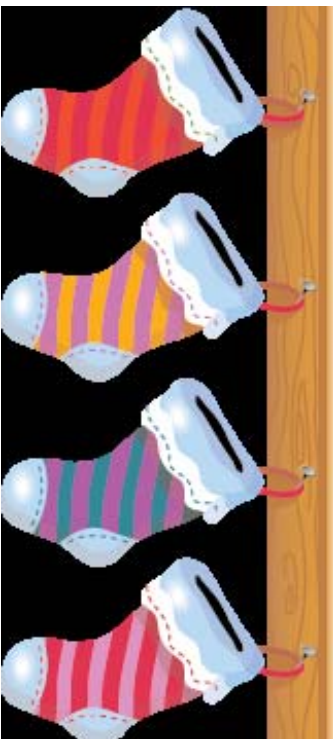
⇨ Glenn County Farm Bureau Office, located at 831 5th Street in Orland, and

- Prepare report of 2-3 pages.

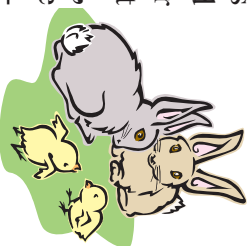

The following ownership requirements will be enforced for the 2010 Grand National Stock Show: All Breeding Animals - 30 consecutive days (must be owned by March 9); Market Beef - 120 consecutive days (must be owned by December 9); Market Swine, Lambs & Goats - 60 consecutive days (must be owned by February 7); Market Rabbits - 30 consecutive days (must be owned by March 9). The 2010 Stock Show also offers non-livestock divisions such as educational displays, a speech contest, multi-media displays, etc. Details will be in the premium book. Premium books for the 2010 Stock Show will not be mailed, but will be available on the website by January, earlier if possible.

Procedures for Glenn County 4-H Livestock Field Day

The Glenn County 4-H Livestock Field Day will be held on **Saturday, November 14**, beginning at 8:00 a.m. The Clover 4-H Club is chairing this event under the direction of Cheryl Massa. We will have the following species available to judge: Horse, Beef, Dairy, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Swine, Sheep, Avian, Cavies & Rabbits, plus a feeds class.

There will be a bell or horn sounded every 10 to 15 minutes to notify everyone when it is time to move to their next judging class.

To begin, Orland High School FFA Advisor/4-H Leader Anna Canon will be presenting on Animal Welfare/Ethics for those members in Int. & Sr. Division. Jamie Marron, 4-H Assistant, will be conducting a similar training for Primary & Jr. Division members. This will meet the members' requirement to attend an Animal Welfare/Ethics meeting. While the scores are being tabulated, the All Stars & BLAST members will be running some fun barnyard games.

Anyone that is interested in helping set up for the field day is welcome. Setup will begin around 7:00 a.m. We are asking those leaders and parents who have agreed to bring animals to have them in place by 7:30 a.m. at the Glenn Co. Fairgrounds. The event will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m.

Memorial Scholarship Fund

Did you know that each year the Glenn County 4-H Council awards several scholarships to graduating seniors? This is done in part by donations that the Council receives from organizations, personal gifts and in memory of a lost one. Volunteer Enrollment

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people involved in Cooperative Extension activities. All volunteer leaders are required to fill out a leader enrollment card (each year), be fingerprinted for a background check and attend an orientation meeting (done one time only, unless there is break in service). After completing these requirements satisfactorily, a leader appointment card will be issued. Any parent who volunteers to chaperone at an event (including 4-H camp) must sign-up as a 4-H leader and go through the above process prior to the event. If you are a volunteer and are not having a project this year but will be returning next year, you may want to keep your enrollment current so you won't need to go through the entire process next year.

We are asking each of you to recruit one new leader. We know everyone is busy with school, church, etc., so encourage them to take the team approach. Two or three leaders can share the six hour minimum project requirement, making their time commitment for a project not as demanding. Without our volunteer leaders, the projects available will decrease and so will our enrollment. Let's all help to keep our youth in Glenn County involved, off the streets and not idle. Also, please remember that all facility use agreements/contracts (for use of school, city, county, state & private facilities) entered into by anyone in the 4-H Program must be sent to the 4-H Office for review and can only be signed by the County Director.

Countywide Presentation Training Offered

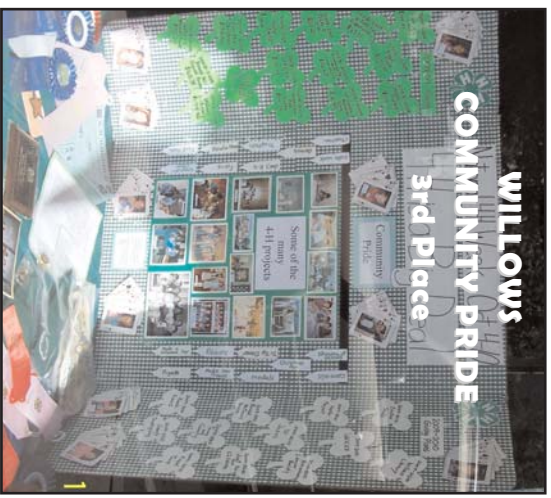
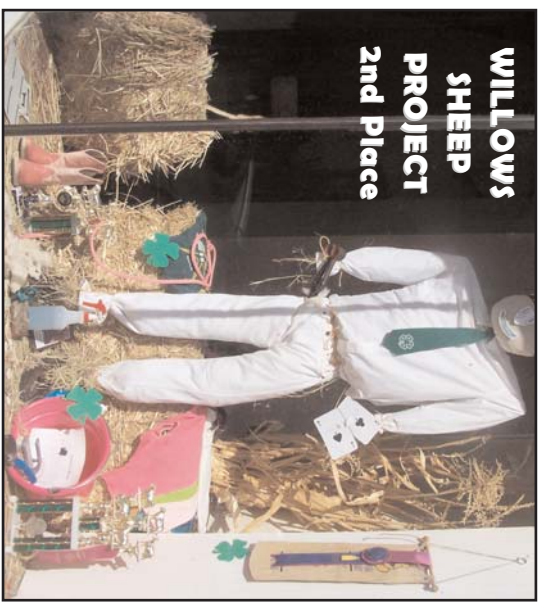
A Countywide Presentation Training will be held on **Tuesday, December 8, 7:00 p.m.**, at the 4-H Office in Orland. It will be geared toward new members and leaders. All 4-H members planning to sell any animals at the Glenn County Fair must give a presentation at the County Presentation Event to be held on **Friday, February 5, 7:00 p.m.**, at the Willows Intermediate School. Those who are 8th grade and older and have given two demonstrations, one of which must be a gold, can sign up to be a judge or encee at the county event instead of giving a demonstration (forms will be included in next Roundup). **HELPFUL HINTS:**

- Plan, prepare and practice.
- Plan ahead by developing the three main parts of your speech.
- Begin preparing and practicing early. Most importantly **BELIEVE IN YOUR MESSAGE**. No matter how much you train and practice, nothing will give you as much self-confidence and persuasiveness as your own interest and belief in the subject.
- INTRODUCTION** - Try to make friends with the audience and arouse their curiosity. Be yourself, be natural.
- BODY** - This is the most important part of your speech and should give the main idea supported with facts, examples or stories.
- CONCLUSION** - End on an upbeat note; leave the audience smiling! Summarize your main points and save the "BEST" for last.

Beef Replacement Heifer Breeding Dates For 2010 Fair

If you plan to sell a bred beef heifer for the 2010 Glenn County Fair, breeding must occur between the dates of **November 8, 2009, - January 25, 2010**, for fall calving. They will calve from August 15, 2010, to November 1, 2010.

Countywide Avian Project

In order to sell fryers at the fair, you do not have to own any chickens now. The fryers are bought 5 weeks before fair. In 5 weeks, they can gain 5 pounds. You only need a pen about 4'x6' to raise them and they don't get old enough to crow. They are a great project if you live in town. Since you don't have to train them and they take little care, they are a good project for busy and/or younger members. The Avian Project includes anything with feathers, so cagebirds (parakeets, cockatiels, parrots, etc.), gamebirds (doves, pheasants, pigeons, turkeys) and water-fowl (ducks & geese) are included. 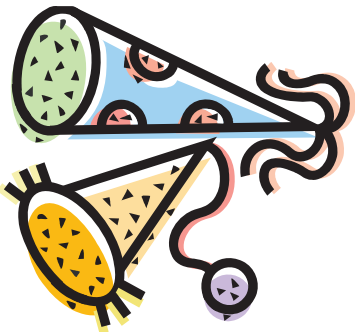
