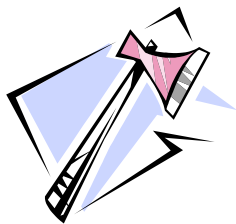

Cooperative Extension Office Hit Hard By County Budget Cuts

As many of you already know, our office was hit very hard by the County budget cuts. This will undoubtedly affect our programming. However, the entire office staff is committed to providing the best possible program within our means.



At this time, we still don't know all of the repercussions of this situation. As of this writing, the 4-H Secretary and Administrative

Services Officer have each been reduced by 20%.

I would like to personally thank each and every one of you who wrote letters, made phone calls or attended the Board of Supervisors meetings in support of our office. I am sure that it did make a difference. Our office was the only one on the list of departments for the additional cuts that weren't asked to take the cuts on the spot at the first meeting. However, we did not fair as well at the second meeting. Even though that meeting did not go the way we would have liked, we gave it our best shot. There were many 4-H members, parents and leaders in attendance at both meetings, many of them in 4-H shirts or uniform.

On August 17th, \$20,000 of the \$35,000 that they took in the second round was reinstated. Unfortunately, even with that reprieve, we are far short of being able to fully staff our office.

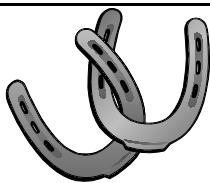

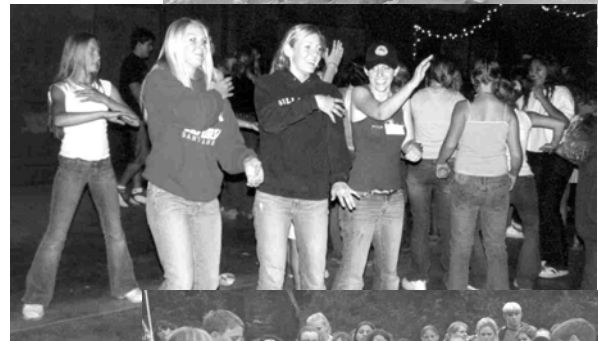
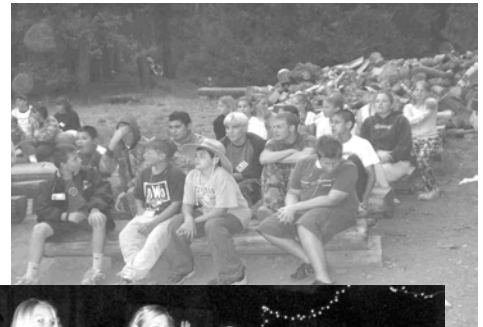

Volunteer Enrollment

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people involved in Cooperative Extension activities. All volunteer leaders are required to fill out a leader enrollment card (each year), be fingerprinted for a background check and attend an orientation meeting (done one time only, unless there is break in service). After completing these requirements satisfactorily, a leader appointment card will be issued. *Any parent who volunteers to chaperone at an event (including 4-H camp) must sign-up as a 4-H leader and go through the above process prior to the event.* If you are a volunteer and are not having project this year but will be returning next year, you may want to keep your enrollment current so you won't need to go through the entire process next year.

We are asking each of you to recruit one new leader. We know everyone is busy with school, church, etc., so encourage them to take the team approach. Two or three leaders can share the six hour minimum project requirement, making their time commitment for a project not as demanding. Without our volunteer leaders, the projects available will decrease and so will our enrollment. Let's all help to keep our youth in Glenn County involved, off the streets and not idle. Also, please remember that all facility use agreements/contracts (for use of school, city, county, state & private facilities) entered into by anyone in the 4-H Program must be sent to the 4-H Office for review and can only be signed by the County Director.
