WHY Conference 2002, “United We Lead”

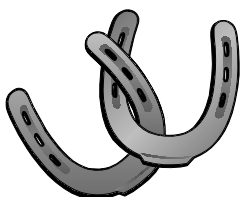

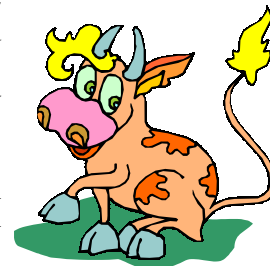
All Leaders Invited to the State Leaders' Forum at Asilomar!

2003 California 4-H Computer Corps

The purpose of the committee is to increase the use and awareness of technology in the 4-H Youth Development Program. Membership is a one-year commitment from January to December, with an optional second year. There are 12-16 members in the committee each year. 6-8 new members are selected each year. Applicant must be age 15 or older (as of January 1 of the year applying). Some criteria for selection are a knowledge of some area of computer technology or use skills, willingness to learn new areas of computer technology, ability to teach youth and adults about computer technology, and access to computer and the Internet. Butte County Horse & Pony Event

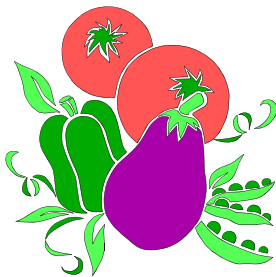

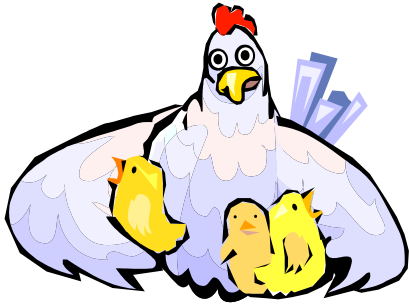
