

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SECOND OLIVE KNOT TREATMENT

Olive knot research that we conducted during the last several years showed that multiple sprays with a copper-containing fungicides resulted in better disease control. In our studies, two sprays gave better control than one and three gave better control than two. The majority of the infection occurred in the spring coinciding with the period of natural leaf drop. The efficacy of the fall applied copper treatment declined by March or April. It may be earlier this year due to the high rainfall we have received.
