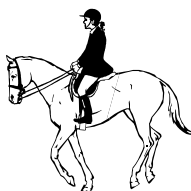
Do You Have Family Members In the Armed Forces Stationed In The Middle East?

CALIFORNIA STATE FAIR INFORMATION

Mandatory for 2003 - As a requirement for entry, all Market Steer, Market Lamb, Market Hog, Market Meat Goat, Market Rabbit, and Market Poultry Pen exhibitors will be required to participate in a State Certified Quality Assurance and Ethics Awareness Training Program prior to the opening of the 2003 California State Fair.

California State Fair offers two QA and Ethics Awareness programs. Tier II trainings qualify the exhibitors for two years of exhibition at the California State Fair (2003 & 2004). Tier III trainings are more extensive and qualify the exhibitor for five years of exhibition at the California State Fair (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007).

4-H State Presentation Day

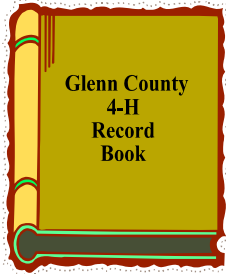

Record Book Project Awards

All 4-H members must submit a record book at the end of the year in order to receive a year pin and stripe, and to sell at next year's Jr.

Livestock Auction. Those with a gold seal can then submit their record books on to county judging. Special awards can be won (even primary members can join in this competition!). Record books will be judged overall, but particularly one project must be chosen and competition is between those in each project. A plaque will be given for the most complete and well-regarded project book, with pins given to the next four highest point-earning books and all others will be given a certificate.



4-H Council Meeting

The next Glenn County 4-H Council meeting will be held **June 16th, at 7:00 p.m.**, at Murdock School in willows. If you have any items you would like to see added to the agenda, please submit them to the 4-H Office by **Friday, June 6th**. Each club is to have at least one teen and one adult representative attend! All leaders and Jr./Teen leaders are encouraged to attend and take part in the program decision-making process.

Jackpot Shows & 4-H

This is the season for jackpot shows in the north state. A jackpot show is defined as one in which entry fees are charged and cash prizes or premiums are awarded from the accumulated entry fees or other matching

funds. However, the ownership and project participation entry requirements of jackpot shows and the handling of premium funds are not consistent with University and state 4-H policies and practices. Therefore, youth may participate in jackpot shows as an individual with their insurance program and protection under the UC liability program will not be extended to include jackpot shows. In addition, 4-H clubs, projects, groups, or councils will not sponsor, co-sponsor or host in any way, jackpot shows. If you have questions, please contact your local 4-H Office. - 5) Thou shalt see that thy child is on time for all show activities for thou would not want to wait on another.
- 6) Thou shalt make sure thy child has animals entered and registration papers in order by the designated time.
- 7) Thou shalt teach the child that winning a blue ribbon is a desirable goal, but making friends along the way is a more worthy goal.
- 8) Thou shalt not complain about the judge for it is his opinion that has been sought.
- 9) Thou shalt remember that livestock projects are teaching projects, not necessarily money-making projects.
- 10) Thou shalt remember that the livestock project is a family project that shall be enjoyed and supported by the entire family.

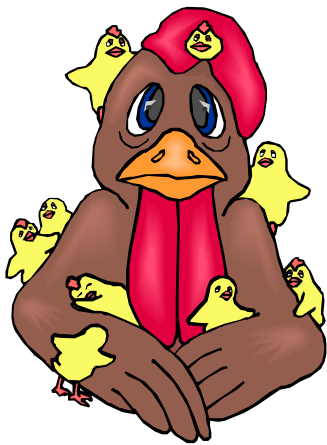
